HELIPORT AND HELIPAD APPROVAL PROCESS

The Miami-Dade Aviation Department (MDAD) does not approve heliport/helipad locations; this is handled by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT).

- 1. Proponent must file form 7480-1 Notice of Landing Area Proposal with the FAA. This form is available at http://forms.faa.gov/forms/faa7480-1.pdf
- 2. Proponent receives letter of acknowledgment from the FAA.
- 3. Proponent checks with local zoning for any heliport restrictions. The contact number for County's Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources (RER) is 305 375-2800.
- 4. Upon receipt of FAA determination letter, the proponent contacts FDOT by applying on their web site for site approval. There is a 45 day waiting period. If no opposition to the proposal is offered, after 45 days, the proponent must register the landing area with FDOT Airport Registration Renewal & New Airport Site Approval by using their website at www.florida-aviation-database.com.
- 5. Proponent must re-register every 2 years thereafter
- 6. FDOT issues site approval letter (by e-mail).
- 7. FDOT helicopter landing pad permits are handled by:
