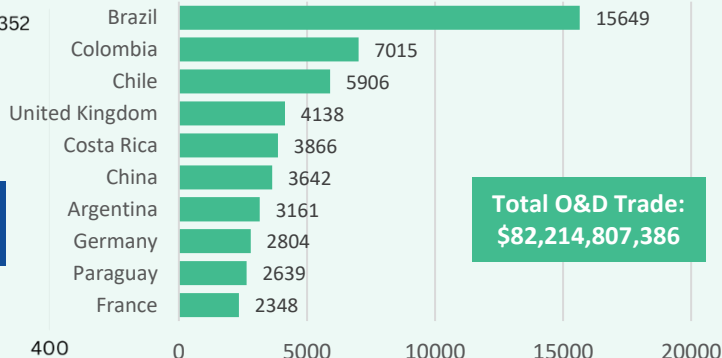

By Weight (in thousands US Tons)

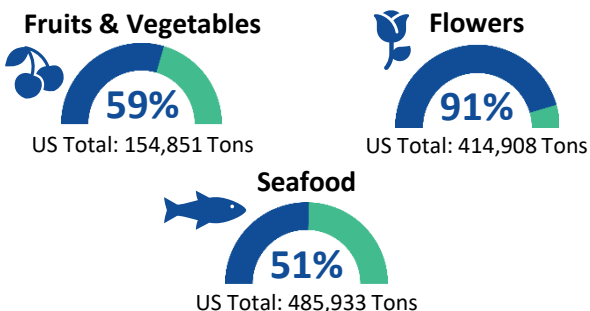


By Value (in millions US Dollars)

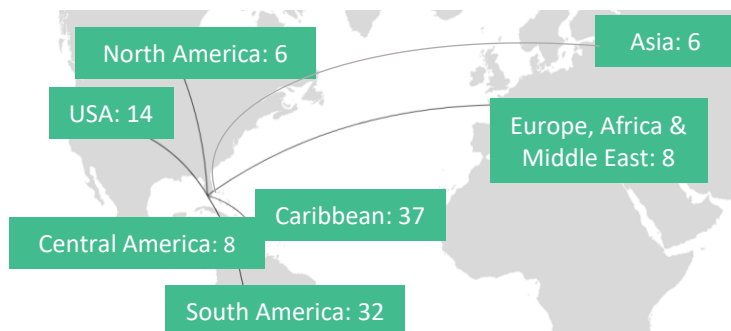


Leading Airport in Perishables Imports
