Capital Improvement Program (CIP):

MIA is receiving an unprecedented investment of \$9 billion in capital improvements and maintenance upgrades over the next 10 years. This will not only address future demands but also improve the overall travel experience, stimulate economic growth, and reinforce MIA's position as a global hub. Projections indicate that by 2040, the airport will accommodate 77 million travelers and more than four million tons of cargo.

Projects include:

- *Central Terminal redevelopment
- *Concourse "F" modernization
- *North Terminal redevelopment (Concourse D West Extension)
- *South Terminal expansion (New Concourse K)
- *New parking garage with over 2,000 parking spaces
- *New privately funded airport hotel

These projects will lead to state-of-the-art facilities, more gates, increased flight capacity, top-quality concessions located beyond security checkpoints and an airport hotel offering convenient accommodation options for both business and leisure travelers.

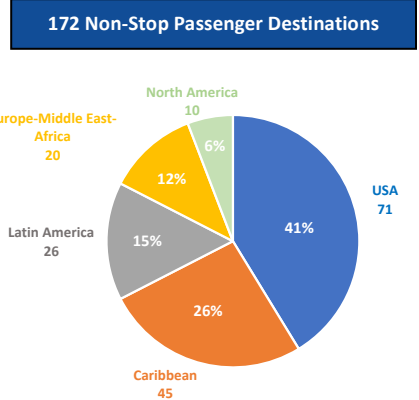

Keeping MIA Competitive (Passenger)

Global Entry: MIA is utilizing the newest Global Entry technology in North and South terminals that leverages on-the-move facial comparison technology for a Seamless Border Entry.

Biometric Facial Comparison

(Inbound Passengers): Offered in all Terminals to all international arriving passengers.

Biometric Facial Comparison

(Outbound Passengers): Currently offered at most gates in the South and Central Terminals. Also expanding to the North Terminal.

TSA Checkpoint 3-D Scanning:

Provides improved explosives detection capabilities at the checkpoint.

Mobile Passport Control: Offered in all Terminals to US Citizens, lawful permanent residents, Canadian B1/B2 citizen visitors, and returning Visa Waiver Program travelers with an approved ESTA.

myMIAccess: An airport initiative offering passengers with disabilities a dedicated platform for accessing services, amenities, and information when traveling through Miami International Airport. myMIAccess programs include the multisensory rooms, wheelchair charging stations, hidden disabilities sunflower lanyards, and Aira - a wayfinding app for passengers who need visual assistance.

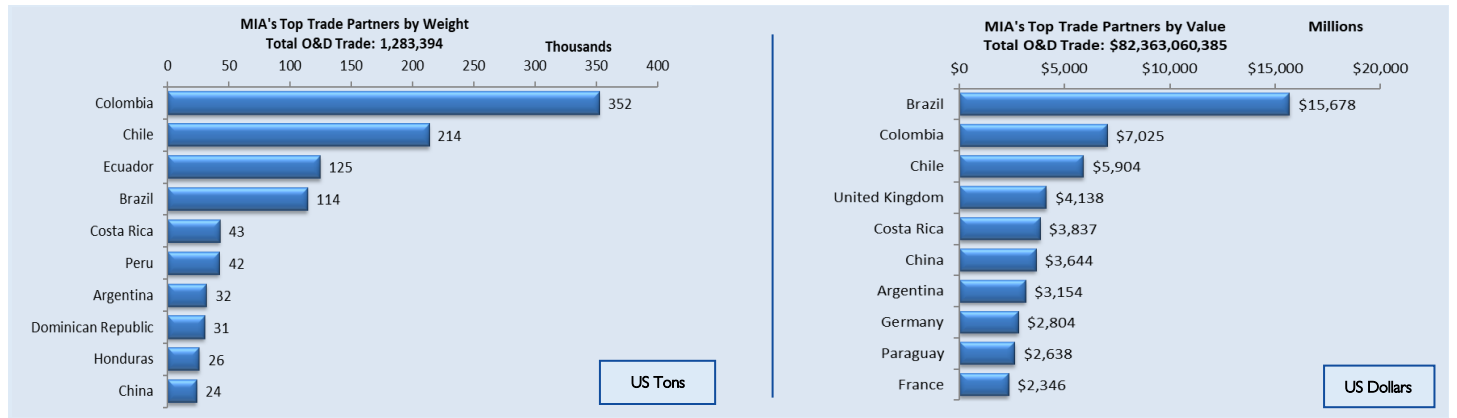

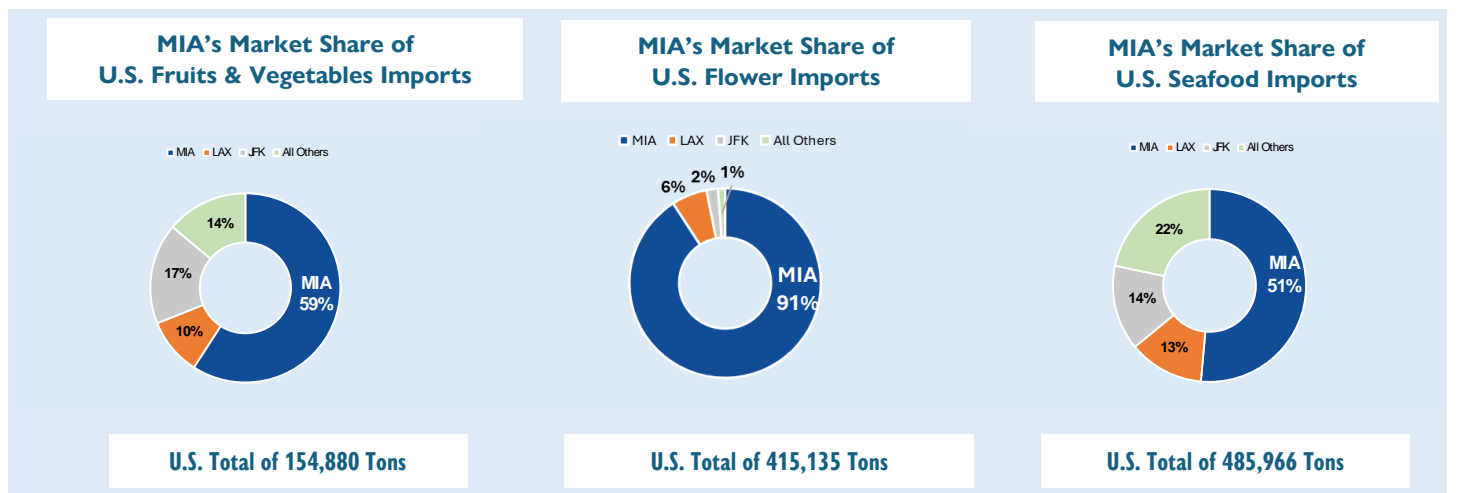

Keeping MIA Competitive (Cargo)

Pharma:

MIA became the first IATA designated "Pharma Hub Airport" in North America for developing a CEIV community of companies. This designation underscores MIA's leading role as both a safe and efficient global logistics hub for high-value, temperature-sensitive pharmaceuticals. Working with MIA, a total of 9 companies have obtained the IATA CEIV pharma certification.

Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ):

An extension of Miami-Dade County's existing FTZ 281 granted to PortMiami, the MIA FTZ is ideally suited for import/export-driven businesses. Cargo Facilities

Cargo: MIA's cargo facilities encompass twenty-four (24) cargo buildings with approximately 2.8 million square feet of warehouse space. Apron space is approximately 5.4 million square feet, with 74 aircraft parking positions.

MIA Cargo Clearance Center: Centralizes the functions of CBP providing for trade documentation processing.

MIA Animal & Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) Facility: Serves as the nation's most comprehensive hub for Veterinary Services' import and export operations and inspection labs, supporting high volumes of agricultural and perishable cargo. It is also home to MIA's live animal quarantine facilities, which handle the transportation of horses, cattle, and other animals.
